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
Manager's Message... **Summer's Coming Soon**

Victory Sends Crews to Arkansas to Help with Ice Storm Recovery Efforts

Our crews assisted Carroll Electric Cooperative, headquartered in Berryville, Arkansas. This electric cooperative estimated they had 56,000 members without power from the ice storm. Sunflower Continues to Pursue Power Plant Expansion Project at Holcomb

Sunflower Electric and its six member-owners are continuing to pursue the Holcomb Expansion Project with both legislative and legal measures to ensure that electric coop members have access to affordable, reliable energy.

The state case, which asserts that Kansas Department of Health and Environment Sec. Bremby did not have authority to deny the air permit, now rests with the Supreme Court. Initially, Sunflower filed petitions for reconsideration and requests for an administrative hearing with the KDHE and filed suit in the Finney County District Court and the Court of Appeals. The Kansas Supreme Court took jurisdiction of the Court of Appeals case but later stayed the case saying the un-

derlying cases should prosecuted prior to the Supreme Court ruling.

In July 2008, Finney County District Court Judge Philip Vieux dismissed the two Holcomb related lawsuits saying he didn't have jurisdiction to rule on the cases, and in December 2008, the Office of Administrative Hearings affirmed the KDHE decision but allowed for a further appeal of his order with Bremby. Since the lower-court remedies have been exhausted, Sunflower is now awaiting word from the Supreme Court.

In November 2008, Sunflower filed a lawsuit in the United States District Court, District of Kansas, against Kansas Gov. Kathleen Sebelius, Lt. Gov. Mark Parkinson, and Bremby, asking for injunctive



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relief related to the October 2007 denial of the air quality. The lawsuit asserts that the defendants, acting in their official capacity, violated Sunflower's right to fair and equal treatment under the law and unlawfully prohibited interstate commerce. On February 5, Judge Melgren heard oral arguments on whether to grant the defendants' motion to dismiss the case and subsequently took the case under advisement.

On the legislative front, legislators are once again grappling with energy issues, hoping to craft a bill that will benefit all Kansans. It is anticipated that the omnibus energy bill could include, among others, the following components: parallel generation, net-metering, renewable portfolio standards, energy efficiency rules and regulations, co-op deregulation, regulatory uniformity and certainty, and municipal generation guarantee.

Sunflower continues to widespread support from legislators who recognize that Holcomb Expansion Project will provide base load power, thousands of jobs for Kansans, and be environmentally sound.
