New Technology Coming to Your Home

Victory Electric Installing New "Smart" AMI Meters

Victory Electric is bringing a new technology to your home through a new "smart" Advanced Meter Infrastructure (AMI) system.

A great advantage of this "smart" technology is the ability for you, the member, to have an in-home display that tells you your usage, carbon footprint, and amount of your monthly bill. This will help you monitor your usage and hopefully conserve energy during peak usage times. In addition to the in-home display, you will have access to a web portal that shows your energy usage. You can compare your home's use by month, day or even by the hour. This information can help you identify inefficient appliances or ways to change your habits to conserve both energy and money.

AMI has four main components, a collector, routers, meters, and the Command Center software. It is considered a two-way, self-healing, mesh communication system, which means the meter "talks" to us and we can "talk" back. The meters all have the capability to "talk" to each other, finding the easiest path to a router. If its path is interrupted, the self-healing feature allows the device to find a path through another meter. The router sends information (i.e. meter reads, errors, meter tampering, etc.) to the collector, which sends the information back to our office into Command Center.

With this technology, we now receive instantaneous meter reads and we know within seconds when a power outage occurs. The system can tell us the location and the extent of an outage and many other details that save our line crews time, which will result in quicker restoration of power for you.

reduced meter reading expenses, load management options, alerts of tampering or theft, remote reconnects and disconnects, and in-home displays. The two-way communications system allows the meter to send readings to the office and it allows the office to the ability to shut-off or turn on the meter in the event of non-pay, disconnect or reconnect.

Victory Electric will first install meters in Dodge City, and then move to the smaller towns in our territory. The collector and router have already been installed. We will install 500 meters for testing purposes before installing the remaining 11,000 meters in Dodge City. We plan to complete Dodge City within 13 to 20 months before moving on to the small towns.

While AMI technology is currently available for those living in town, we also researching ways to bring the AMI technology to our members who live in the rural areas. Our ultimate goal is to have our whole system automated.



Cold Weather Rule: Nov. 1 to March 31

Cooperative members who are unable to pay their electric bills during the cold weather period may qualify for this program, provided they fulfill certain good faith requirements when attempting to pay.

The requirements members must meet to qualify for the program are summarized below.

- ► Members must notify the cooperative and state their inability to pay their service bill in full.
- ▶ Members must apply to federal, state, local or other financial assistance programs for which they may be eligible to receive aid in paying utility bills.
- ► Members and the cooperative will reach a mutually agreeable payment arrangement.

Please note that failure to follow the requirements, illegally diverting utility service, receiving service by tampering, or defaulting on a payment agreement, will disqualify you from receiving the benefits under the Cold Weather Rule.

In no event will the cooperative disconnect a service if the temperature is forecast to fall below 35° Fahrenheit, or be in the mid 30s or colder within 24-hours following the time of disconnection.

The Cold Weather Rule is to ensure human health and safety are not unreasonably endangered during the cold weather months.
